SPS-BS Members: £10 for first entry and £8 for any additional entries, except Progeny Classes 37a - d (£12) Non-Members: £15 for first entry and £12 for any additional entries, except Progeny Class 37a - d (£18) HOYS Qualifier Class 39 (Members £23/Non Members £28 \*Including a £13 Horse of the Year Show Contribution)

**Please Note:** exhibitor numbers/buffet tickets will not be posted to you, these will be available to collect from the Show Secretary on show day. Should you require a receipt please include a SAE with entries.

**AGM:** The AGM of the SPS-BS will take place at 6.30pm on Friday 26<sup>th</sup> July 2019 in the Multi Use Studio in Clickimin Leisure Centre, Lerwick, ZE1 0PJ.

**Buffet Dance:** The buffet dance will take place on the evening of Saturday 27<sup>th</sup> July 2019 in the Sound Public Hall, Lerwick, ZE1 0LY. Tickets are £20 each and can be purchased using the attached form. Numbers are limited so tickets will be sold on a first come first served basis.

**Dogs** must be kept on leads at all times whilst on the Showground and it is the responsibility of the owners to clean up after their dogs.

Catering facilities will be available on site throughout the day of the show.

#### Stabling

Stabling will be available at various sites throughout mainland Shetland, including stalls lined with plywood at Shetland Marts, 13' x 8', from 7am on Friday 19 July to 5pm on Monday 29 July at a cost of £30 per night for up to 4 nights and any additional nights will be charged at £15 per night. Bedding and hay are not supplied. Exhibitors are responsible for supplying their own. Straw must be used for bedding. Straw, Hay and Feed are available to buy locally if required. All stables must be cleaned out on departure.

This show is run under the rules of the SPS-BS, BDS and NPS Scotland, upon entry exhibitors are deemed to be familiar with the aforementioned rules. The ongoing equine influenza situation is being continually monitored and a further announcement regarding any change to vaccination requirements for the 2019 Shetland Pony Breed Show will be made on 18 May 2019.

#### SPSBS Breed Show 2019 General Rules and Conditions of Entry

- 1. Ponies entered must be registered in, or in the case of foals, be eligible for registration in the SPSBS Stud book.
- 2. All ponies must be named on the Entry Form.
- 3. No entries will be taken on the show field.
- 4. The show committee reserves the right to split and/or amalgamate classes as necessary depending on entries and to replace a Judge if necessary.
- 5. Judging to commence at 8.00 am and will not be delayed under any circumstances.
- 6. Classes in the three In-Hand rings will run concurrently which may lead to slight delays.
- 7. Once judging of a class has commenced, no late arrivals will be admitted to the ring. It is the responsibility of the Competitor to be in the ring on time.
- 8. Any objection must be made IN WRITING to the Secretary within ONE HOUR of the alleged incident, together with a deposit of £50, which will be refunded if the objection is upheld.
- 9. Foals must not be exhibited under 5 weeks of age.
- 10. Three-year-old fillies with foal at foot may not be shown.
- 11. Brown ponies are classed as black.
- 12. Ridden and driven ponies must be 4 years old or over, and no lactating mares in ridden or driven classes.
- 13. Colts and Stallions of 2 years old and over must be shown bitted.
- 14. Ridden stallions MUST display a stallion bridle badge. In-hand colts/stallions 2 years and over are advised to display a stallion bridle badge.
- 15. There must be no colts or stallions in Young Handler classes.
- 16. Stallions and colts (except foals) may not be shown in hand by children under 14 years; or ridden by children under 12 years.
- 17. All riders, cones drivers, and handlers aged 14 years and under must wear a correctly secured, current British Standard skull cap or riding hat.
- 18. A Novice Pony is one not to have been placed 1st in any class prior to the closing date of entries.

- 19. A pony is eligible to compete in ONE RING ONLY with the exception of the Ridden, Driven, Young Handler, Progeny and Veteran Classes.
- 20. If any pony is found to be suffering from an infectious or contagious disease, it must be removed from the Showground immediately upon the request of the Show Committee or the Vet.
- 21. The organisers shall not be liable for injury or loss from any cause or circumstance whatsoever to any person, animal, or property. It is a condition of entry that each exhibitor and competitor shall indemnify the show against any such matters and is acknowledged by the signing of the entry form. By signing the entry form exhibitors agree to abide by the rules, code of conduct and procedures of the Pony Breeders of Shetland Association and Shetland Pony Stud-Book Society.
- 22. Only one handler per pony is permitted in the In-Hand classes.
- 23. Exhibitors must be appropriately dressed, and no individual stud, person or pony names displayed in the ring.
- 24. All riders in the Open Ridden class must be of a suitable height and weight for the pony they are riding.
- 25. Ponies in the Ridden classes must be shown in a suitable bridle.
- 26. Whips may be no more than 30 inches long and spurs are not permitted.
- 27. In Ridden classes the rider will be required to perform an individual show. All ponies shall be in the ring for the whole duration of the class. Should a rider fall off at any time whilst in the ring, both pony and rider must leave the ring with the rider dismounted and take no further part in that class.
- 28. Exhibitors should be aware, a Judge may not:
  - a. place a pony which to his/her knowledge has been bred, sold, leased, or produced by the judge or his/her immediate family, partner, business partner or employer.
  - b. place a pony in which he/she has had a financial interest since 1<sup>st</sup> January of the preceding year.
  - c. place a stallion by whom he/she has had a mare stinted in this season.
  - d. judge any rider/handler who has shown a horse/pony owned, produced, or trained by him/her since 1<sup>st</sup> January of the preceding year. Should a situation arise when such a pony appears a referee, preferably on the appropriate panel of judges, should be appointed by the Show Secretary to place the pony in question in its position in the class
- 29. No ponies to be left on a parked vehicle overnight.
- 30. Mobile phones must be switched off whilst in the ring.
- 31. Where classes are affiliated to societies other than the SPSBS the other society's (NPS/BDS) rules take precedence.

Foals are not eligible. **The Champion & Reserve Champion** in all Mixed, pure-bred M & M, or Breed Championships will qualify for the Final which will take place at the Blair Castle International Horse Trials on Friday 23rd August 2019. **Qualification may go to 3<sup>rd</sup> in the Championship (ie 1<sup>st</sup> Reserve Champion)**

#### NPS/Baileys Horse Feeds Mountain & Moorland Ridden Shetland Pony of the Year

This competition is open to stallions, mares and geldings, four years old and over, to be registered in, and complying with the showing requirements of, the main body of their respective stud books. Riders and Owners must be members of their respective Breed Society, NPS, Ponies (UK), The Showing Register or BSPS. Ponies must not exceed the height limits as stipulated by the relevant Breed Societies. Riders of stallions must have obtained their 12th Birthday (small breeds) or 14th birthday (large breeds) before 1st January in the current year.

These classes will be run in accordance with the general rules as set out in the Horse of the Year Show rulebook, a copy of which can be downloaded from <u>www.hoys.co.uk</u>. This is a Horse of the Year Show Qualifier, all data given upon entry of this class is provided to Grandstand Media Limited (GML) and stored on the Grandstand Entries System. For full policy details please visit <u>www.grandstandentries.com</u>. All Animals competing in Mountain and Moorland classes will be required to be in possession of a current/valid JMB height certificate within 28 days of the notification of qualification from Horse of the Year Show or by the closing date of Horse of the Year Show entries, whichever is sooner. Failure to do so may result in qualification of the pony being removed, at the discretion of Grandstand Media Ltd. Marks will be awarded in the following way:

Show, freedom of action - 50 maximum

Breed type and conformation - 50 maximum

In the case of equality, the pony with the highest show, freedom of action mark will be deemed the winner. If there is still equality at this point, then the judges' decision will be final. This class is a qualifying class for Horse of the Year Show, NEC, Birmingham, 2nd - 6th October 2019. Qualification will not pass below 3rd Place. Qualification will be verified by the Horse of the Year Show office.

This class will also be a Qualifying round for the **NPS Scotland/Baileys Horse Feeds Open Ridden Mountain & Moorland Championship.** Rider any age, except stallions where riders must be 12 years old or over. The owner does not have to be an NPS Scotland member for the pony to enter this competition, but the owner must become a member to enter the final. To be shown in any suitable bridle. Ponies must be shown in a snaffle bit with the lead rein attached to the noseband. Ponies must not be cantered. Ponies may not be ridden side saddle. Handles on saddles are permitted. The 2 highest placed ponies in the Lead Rein Class not already qualified will go forward to the final which will take place at the Blair Castle International Horse Trials on Friday 23rd August 2019. Qualifications to go no lower than 4<sup>th</sup> place.
